Field Trips

This year we ran 10 successful field trips in Illinois, with the highlight no doubt being our Iowa & Illinois Young Birder Weekend. Many months of careful planning went into this event. Here are just a few highlights from the year

- 10 expertly guided field trips to three states Iowa, Illinois, and Indiana
- Held joint field trips with both Iowa and Indiana Young Birders
- Joint field trip with Chicago Ornithological Society
- 94 young birder participants from Iowa, Illinois and Indiana (+25% increase from 2013), 34 unique attendees (48% increase from 2013)
- 9 = average number participants (80% increase from 2013)
- 78% of our participants attended more than one field trip
- 16 fully vetted field trip leaders
- Guided field trips and Attendance by young birders and their families from three states including lowa, Illinois, and Wisconsin
- 200 species of birds observed
- Donations provided by individuals and organizations like Eagle Optics, authors Richard Crossley and Margaret Barker, and others
- Event t-shirts designed by Karen Gross
- Photography and videography provided by Tim Frakes Productions
- An evening program with 2010 ABA Young Birder of Year Recipient, Rachael Butek of Colfax, WI
