Membership

ILYB currently has 55 active members comprised of:

- New Members in 2015 18!
- 43 boys (78%) and 12 girls (22%)

Field Trips

This year we ran 9 successful field trips in Illinois. Here are just a few highlights from the year

- 9 expertly guided field trips to two states Iowa and Indiana
- Held joint field trips with both Iowa and Indiana Young Birders
- Joint field trip with Illinois Ornithological Society
- 95 young birder participants (1 more than 2014), 45 unique attendees (32% increase from 2014)
- 11 = average number participants (22% increase from 2014)
- 58% of our participants attended more than one field trip
- 16 fully vetted field trip leaders
- 148 species of birds observed
